Benchmark Testing Round 2 - January 17-19, 2023

Parents and Students should have received an email (and follow-up text) from Ms. Miller regarding the second round of benchmark testing. We look forward to seeing growth in all our students!

Remember that successful performance on the benchmark tests can add five (5) percentage points to marking period 2 grades for growth or ten (10) percentage points to marking period grades for growth of one or more grade levels. This is being offered as an incentive to take these tests seriously.

All students district-wide will participate in benchmark testing to measure academic growth. It is essential that students do their best on these tests, so we have an accurate understanding of both their skills and where they need help. Please make sure they have a good breakfast on their testing day and bring their Chromebooks and chargers with them to Chester High School.

For our Elementary and Middle School Students, the testing program is called iReady.

For our High School Students, the testing program is called MAP (Measures of Academic Progress).

All testing must be completed in person in a proctored session. Ms. Miller will meet and greet students entering the building. Ms. Floyd will be the coordinator proctoring the sessions.

Please be prompt on your scheduled testing day. The sooner we can start the sooner everyone will be finished.

All students will be provided breakfast for morning sessions and can receive lunch if they are still testing at 10:30 AM. Students coming for the 11:30 session will be provided lunch.

All students can leave as soon as they are completed testing.

Digital Academy Offered Electives Spring Semester 2023

In an effort to be fair and equitable, and understanding that some students have had difficulty adjusting to the digital format, we are making the following concessions to electives for the spring semester.

In general, the following conditions apply.

For Elementary and Middle School Students (where credits are not accrued towards graduation)

- All Elementary and Middle School Electives are being extended to a full year for completion. This means that if you/your student did not complete a semester-length course they will be able to and must complete the coursework by June.
- If you/your student completed one of their electives they are free to sign up for an additional elective in the spring semester.

For High School Students (where credits are accrued towards graduation)

- Year-Long courses are not affected all students must complete the course by June regardless of enrollment date
- If your student completed a semester-length elective course
 - They will be able to sign up for additional electives
 - They will receive credit for the course on the second quarter report card
- If your student did not complete a semester-length course and was enrolled prior to November 1st
 - Your student will not pass the course for the semester, and this will be reflected on their transcript
 - Your student will have the opportunity to complete the coursework in the Spring semester and
 - They will receive the credit at the end of the school year if they complete the course
 - Students are not required to complete courses they failed for the semester, but the option is available if they wish to take advantage of the opportunity.
- If your student did not complete a semester-length course and was enrolled after November 1st
 - Your student will receive an Incomplete (I) on the second quarter report card
 - Your student will be able to complete the coursework and receive credit at the end of the year
- All high school students should remain aware of their credit status and schedule
 additional electives as needed to ensure graduation or promotion to the next grade.
 This is the student's responsibility to track Ms. Floyd and Mr. Thompson are
 available to help but will not make decisions for the students.
