The budget for the school year was set and we have utilized all allocated funds to enhance the learning opportunities for our students. After assessing the facilities studies there were some specific needs identified. As we look to enhance our educational outcomes for our students we also want to make sure we provide facilities that are conducive to learning. It is obvious that we will need to make investments in both very important areas (facilities and educational services).
10. Please provide the cost of the debt to purchase 1350 and 1450.11. When does repayment start?	The district borrowed \$32 million dollars at a 6.2% coupon rate. Said bond has a maturity date of 06/30/2043. The cost to borrow is \$31,628,473.33. In total the district will repay \$63,628,473.33 The repayment schedule is attached to the email Dr. Mumin sent. The Bond Debt Service Schedule can be found here . Repayment began in October of 2022. The district has already made two interest payments (October 2022 and April 2023). That is also reflected in the repayment schedule.

All afterschool programs have an academic and enrichment portion per the 21st Century Learning Center Grant requirements. We will continue to look at leveraging out of school time to support student success in reading, math, and science. Staffing programs at various sites has been difficult and may result in a more grade level(s) focused approach to programming.
21. Please share the outcome of the Court Hearing with the public.	Receiver, Nichols provided additional feedback during. However, for a more indepth analysis, please review the court transcripts.
22. What is the plan to turn around the 57% attendance rate?	There have been several meetings held with building principals and the truancy department to ensure that we can see a significant improvement for the 23-24 school year. One of the key factors that have been identified is the lack of following school code. There are requirements that students must meet that have not been followed. However, the

	lack of enforcement of some of the expectations have allowed students to continue to have poor attendance. That will be corrected for the upcoming school year.
23. Youth Court brings about change. Why doesn't CUSD have Youth Court?	There are currents of Youth Court taking place currently in some of our buildings. We are also seeking funding to create a more robust program district wide.
24. What is the status of the intercom system at Chester High School?	We recently had a company visit Chester High School, The week of April 17th to assess the costs to repair the entire system. During their assessment it was discovered that there are two separate systems in the building that are not tied to one another. To marry the two systems will take some time. However, we are currently bidding out that job to be completed before the start of the 23-24 school year.
