REPORT FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT

Juan Baughn – It is great to see so many of you came out to welcome me back to Chester. I just wanted to share a couple of things with you. The first thing I want to say is that I am honored to be asked to come back and I feel privileged to be here. I am going to bring forward at our next Board Meeting detail about this, but some of you received a document that looks like this (*in file*). I will be distributing this throughout the community tomorrow and what it talks about is our instructional core and what I and Dr. Pearson and others have been working on. And what we have been working on is how we improve our classroom practices, our instructional practices, our professional development around student achievement and how do we expend or energy, funds and mental capacities around improving our lot in each classroom in this district. I believe that every student, every student in this district can learn, and learn at a high level. And I am not talking about learn, I said at a high level. I said this before and the reason I am back is because I didn't finish my mission and my mission is to do everything I can to help you to make sure our students are prepared for college and/or career without remediation. I am talking about without remediation, I expect nothing less and I am going to work with you and you and all of this to see how we can make this happen.

STUDENT RECOGNITION – **Andria Saia** – Although the students are not here because the win was only yesterday, I wanted to give a shout-out to Chester High's Bocce Team. We have boys and girls that play on an integrated team and we thrashed Springfield soundly yesterday. We have a home match at STEM on February 20th. So please come out and support our Bocce Team.

PRESENTATIONS – There was a first reading of Board Policies #012 – Conflicts of Interest, #253 – Suicide Awareness Prevention and Response, #626 with attachments - Finances & #626.1 – Travel Reimbursement - Federal Programs. Copies were provided at the meeting as well as on the website. Andria Saia gave a brief description of each policy.

COMMENDATIONS

APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING OF DECEMBER 16, 2016

Receiver Barsz approved.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Karen Miah – she wanted tell the Administration that they did an MLK Day of Service, but had to do it outside the District because there was nothing in place for the District. She thinks we need to have something in place as everybody knows when Martin Luther King Day is. She wanted the girls to come to the High School but had to go outside of Chester High School to her church. She wanted to make sure that there are community service projects in place, since when they are applying for scholarships, it is essential that they have done community service. She said that they take a lot of pride in Chester and don't get a lot of choice because the people sitting at that table don't come from Chester, they'd like to work in their community and there were a lot of other organizations that were willing to do work, but there was nothing available. Our schools need help and they are willing to help them.

Peter Barsz – I couldn't agree with you more and that was certainly an oversight on our part and we will make sure that doesn't ever happen again.

Wanda Mann – Wanted to come in and welcome back Dr. Baughn and thank him for coming back when we needed him. He wanted to let him know that he is respected in the community and glad that the District called him to come back to help.

Dennis Martinelli – He thanked the teachers for coming out to the meeting. He told Peter (Barsz, Receiver) that Dr. Christopher McGinley, Interim CRO, was not welcome back in this district. He is only an interim and he made a comment when in teacher negotiations that if they didn't approved the contract that he was leaving. He believes that he is just here getting a check as he is not from the community. He heard that he got a big offer in Philadelphia and wants him to just go. He said that if Dr. McGinley comes back in this building he will be here with 10 parents blocking him in the halls and making a ruckus. He said that there are others that need to go but he is just starting with Dr. McGinley this month. He believes that the teachers deserve a contract. He is upset about us giving a \$30,000 raise to an employee that was made an Assistant Superintendent from a Director position. He thinks that it can't be justified as long as the teachers are still working without a contract and a raise. He thinks the district needs to be under the Elected Board and fixed by home-grown as the current Administration don't know what is going on and anything about our community. He believes that the come in to pad their pockets on the kids back and then leave with nothing fixed. He said that there are people that are threatening lawsuits and they are going to take back the school district. He believes that nothing is getting any better; it is only getting worse every single day. He also threatened to come to school with other parents and block the entrances to the schools so the kids can't come in until the teachers get a contract.

Kevin Greene – He wanted to let the Administration know that he has to go to court because of an incident at CUSA Elementary School regarding his nephew, who is a student there, and his sister, student's mother. He and the mother spoke with Principal Ferguson about the bullying of the student, of which Ms. Ferguson said she had no knowledge. He then went to then Superintendent Shannon and Mr. Shannon's response was to move the child to another school. Mr. Greene sent a letter to Ms. Ferguson regarding the safety issues in her school and his concerns of which he heard no response. A few days later he received a certified letter stating that he was no longer allowed to come to CUSA with a cc: to Mr. Shannon and he Security staff. He then received a Summons that he had to appear in court with accusations of harassment. He said he went to Ms. Ferguson for help and was told that it was no "protocol" to meet with the Principal that he had to meet with the Climate Manager. He asked why but was given no answer. He then met with Ms. Saia and was told that same thing, that it was not "protocol". He has not heard from anyone since regarding this except for the letter and summons. He wanted to know how the Administration allows Ms. Ferguson to make false accusations, trump up false charges, and have you pay for lawyers and nothing is being done.

Peter Barsz – As this is an ongoing matter, I cannot comment on this.

John Shelton, Jr. – He extended his welcome back to Dr. Baughn. He didn't agree with one of the previous speakers that were at the podium screaming and hollering and making threats. He is here asking for help from the Superintendent. He believes we need to get the contract straightened out. The contract needs to be fair for everyone, the teachers that have been here and the new teachers and for the long term for their futures. He said that the last contract that was proposed was actually in his favor, but not for all, so we must start again. He believes that even though it didn't work out, it doesn't mean we stop; it means we go on to something else. He said that we need to get it resolved so that the teachers, community and students have some comfort level. He thinks that the buildings need to be resolved. He also said that if they want to come to the schools

and stand out on the streets in protest, let them come, they could be eyes on the street, but if they think they are going to block our kids from entering the schools, it "ain't gonna happen". As long as we keep the schools open, our kids are going to school and these people come to work. Do not deny our children education. He said that they (the government) have been trying to shut us down for years, but they can't because our teachers come to work.

Jean Arnold – *Asked to speak and was granted permission.* She said that in reference to MLK Day of Service, the district did have an activity with the Salvation Army. Mr. Jones, from STEM, helped her do a certificate that was given to participants because she did an educational workshop there. Will Richan, who is here, was part of that committee that put that on. She asked that whoever is interested talk to Mr. Richan after the meeting to get his information, so they can participate more fully in that event next year. She wanted to go on record that two of the Chester Upland School District who helped her prepare - Andrew Sales and Mr. Jones. She suggested that more people from the community get involved so we can have more activities next year.

C-4 Approval of the Resolution to Change Tax Collectors Compensation – Borough of Upland

WHEREAS, on May 25, 1945, the Pennsylvania General Assembly passed Act of May 25, 1945, P.L. 1050, No. 394, entitled the “Local Tax Collection Law”;

WHEREAS, Section 36.1 of Local Tax Collection Law states “when any taxing district or taxing authorities propose to either raise or reduce the compensation or salary for the office of an elected tax collector, such action shall be by ordinance or resolution, finally passed or adopted prior to the fifteenth day of February of the year of the municipal election. (36.1 amended Dec. 22, 1965, P.L. 1145, No.443)”.

WHEREAS, the Chester Upland School District is a Second Class school district in the County of Delaware, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, and

WHEREAS, the Receiver, acting as the Board of School Directors for Chester Upland School District desires to ensure that the compensation paid to the Tax Collector is fair and equitable and reflects the work performed and the responsibilities assumed to the greatest degree possible; and

WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of the Receiver, acting as the Board of School Directors for the Chester Upland School District to establish the compensation of the Tax Collector for the collections of all real estate taxes for the year 2018 and thereafter.

WHEREAS, after due consideration, the Receiver, acting as the Board of School Directors for the Chester Upland School District has arrived at a compensation system for the tax collectors of the school district; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to 72 P.S.5511.36a, that the compensation for the office of elected tax collector for the Borough of Upland, Pennsylvania, for the collection of all duly authorized tax bills is as follows:
